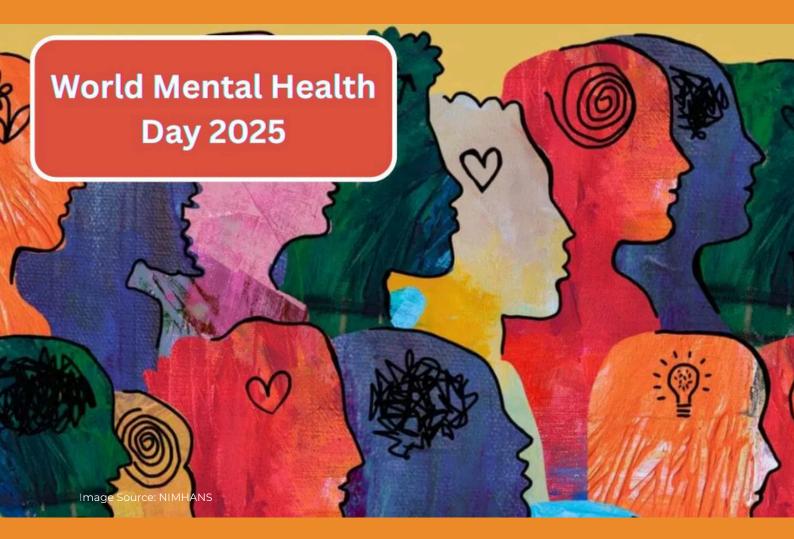

World Mental Health Day: A Global Call for Collective Wellbeing

Established in 1992 by the World Federation for Mental Health (WFMH), World Mental Health Day remains the only annual global awareness campaign dedicated to focusing attention on mental health and mental disorders. Today, it is commemorated across more than 90 countries every October 10, through local, regional, and national initiatives that amplify the shared call for understanding, compassion, and action in mental health. As the world continues to face natural disasters, conflicts, pandemics, and humanitarian crises, mental health care often remains one of the most overlooked and underfunded priorities in emergency response. Amid the rubble and recovery, the need to protect psychological wellbeing is more urgent than ever.



In India, the day highlights the importance of ensuring accessible, affordable, and inclusive mental health services for all, particularly in times of crisis. It reinforces the ongoing effort to challenge stigma, encourage open conversations, and build systems that nurture care and connection.

Each year's theme mirrors the evolving understanding of mental health; from workplace wellbeing and youth empowerment to emergency care and universal human rights. Sangath's SEHER intervention travels to Japan!

Sangath's flagship school-based mental health program, SEHER, is making its way to classrooms in Tokyo, Japan! In July, Dr. Vikram Patel and Prachi Khandeparker from Sangath visited Japan, where the Tokyo Metropolitan Institute of Medical Science is adapting and testing the SEHER model for public schools in Tokyo.

Dr. Patel serves as the Research Advisor, while Prachi leads as the Intervention and Implementation Advisor for the project. During their visit, they met with the local research team, school staff, and students — engaging in rich exchanges to help contextualize SEHER for Japanese schools.

Training on Mental Health First-aid:

Kedar Mirchandani, Luanna Fernandes, Seema Sambari, Subhash Pednekar, Miriam Sequeira, Sneha Pednekar, and Rakshanda Paimpari trained 14 participants from the top management of shelf-drilling Mumbai in identifying signs of distress in their colleagues and responding empathetically.

Thinking Healthy Program- Peer delivered Training:

The trainings were focused on providing ASHA workers with knowledge of Maternal mental health, including perinatal depression and how to provide the THPP counselling sessions to a patient.

Maternal Mental Health Training:

The 'Maternal Mental Health Awareness' training is focused on teaching the ASHA workers about the awareness video and the discussion that is to be held with women and their family members regarding the importance of maternal mental health. It also involves teaching them the navigation of the Mindscroll app.

Lalan Palan Training:

The trainings were focused on Early Childhood Development (ECD) and aimed to provide Anganwadi workers with in-depth knowledge related to the overall development of children during the first two years of life.

Ningalude Paricharanathile Nirabhedangal, Kerala Guide released:

The guide for medical educators in Kerala on LGBTQIA+ affirmative care – Ningalude Paricharanathile Nirabhedangal, was published on 27th August 2025.

Characterizing modifications to the mental health gap action programme (mhGAP) intervention guide during implementation in low- and middle-income countries using the framework for reporting adaptations and modifications to evidence-based interventions: a systematic review of reviews:

Harikeerthan Raghuram, Mythili Menon Pathiyil, Aakrushi Brahmbhatt, and Anant Bhan contribution to this paper suggested strengthening frameworks to improve documentation and enhance implementation in LMICs settings where Modification plays a vital role in making interventions responsive to diverse community settings

Optimizing treatment for depression in primary care using psychotherapy versus antidepressant medication in a low-resource setting: protocol for the OptimizeD randomized controlled trial: The OptimizeD randomized controlled trial is one of the largest precision mental health studies conducted in a low-resource context, based in Bhopal, India. Aiming to determine whether personalized treatment-through behavioral activation therapy or antidepressant medication-can lead to better outcomes for people with depression in primary care.

"Common Definitions" in Mental Health Science: Sangath India, together with the Global Mental Health Peer Network (GMHPN), and commissioned by the Wellcome Trust, has developed "Common Definitions in Mental Health Science" towards building a shared, inclusive, and globally relevant language for mental health science-one that honors lived experiences, bridges research, and makes care more equitable worldwide.

Scaling up the task-sharing of an evidence-based psychological treatment for depression in rural India: an implementation study: The paper demonstrated how ASHAs were trained and supported to deliver the Healthy Activity Program (HAP) adding to the growing evidence that task-sharing approaches in mental health can bridge treatment gaps make quality mental health care accessible and bring effective care to underserved communities.

A Conversational Agent (PracticePal) to Support the Delivery of a Brief Behavioral Activation Treatment for Depression in Rural India: Development and Pilot-Testing Study: The pilot study was conducted in Raisen district of Madhya Pradesh, with 30 patient participants receiving the Healthy Activity Program (HAP). The chatbot PracticePal was designed as a therapy-aid to be used alongside HAP treatment by patients.



Public Engagement/ Campaigns

SAHARA project launched a Reel-making competition across 8 districts of Madhya Pradesh with THPP-trained ASHAs. The activity required ASHAs to develop short reels (30 seconds to 1 minute) on maternal mental health and related topics.

The objective was to encourage knowledge dissemination through creative formats and assess the engagement of ASHAs with key project themes.



The ceremony was attended by the Chief Medical and Health Officer (CMHO), District Immunization Officer (DIO), District Community Mobilizer (DCM), and the Sangath team.

The top three reels were adjudged winners, and prizes were awarded through a formal distribution ceremony. The 1st prize winner received a mobile phone, the 2nd prize winner received a cooler, and the 3rd prize winner received a mixer grinder. This initiative served both as a capacity-strengthening and motivation-building exercise for the participating ASHAs.
